US 30 East from Wayne/Stark County Line

Ohio's award-winning pavement is a 4.7-mile section of US 30 that begins at the Wayne/Stark county line and runs east. The divided highway, with two lanes in each direction, has carried approximately 23 million ESALs since it was opened to traffic in 1970.

The Ohio Department of Transportation built the road with a 14-inch base and surfaced it with 2.5 inches of HMA. The pavement received a 1.5-inch overlay in 1987 and some spot repairs on its eastern half in 2001. ODOT planed the road 3 inches and overlaid it with 3.25 inches of Superpave HMA in 2007.

Despite heavy snowfall and heavy truck traffic, the road has continued to provide motorists with a quality ride for 38 years.
